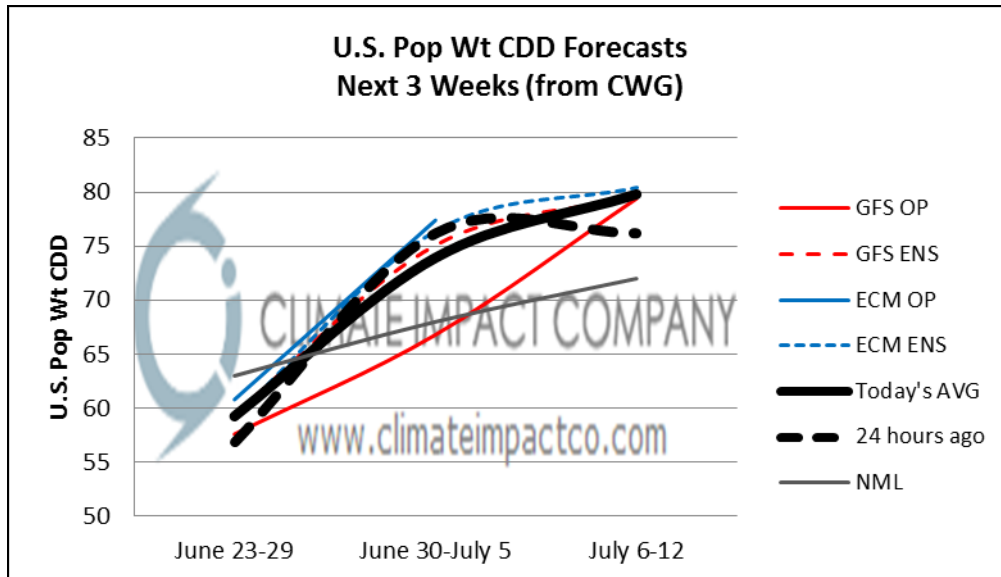
Headline: The cool late June pattern fades early July.

Admin: Out of office July 1-8

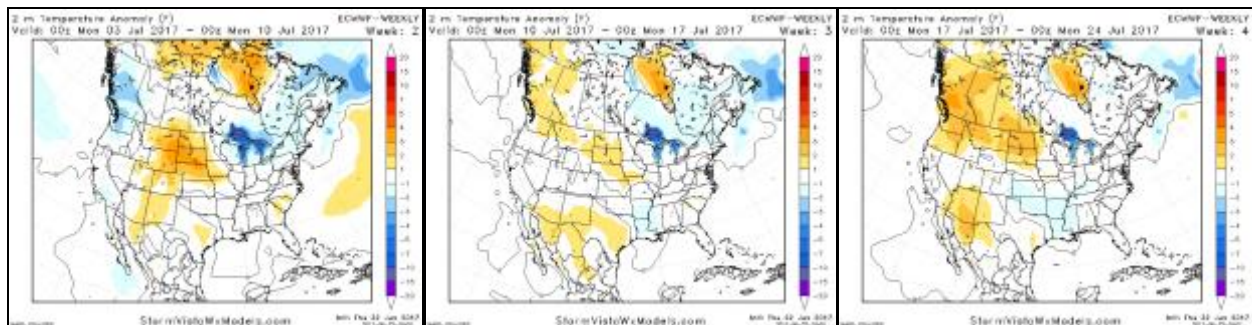
### 1. U.S. CDD tracker turns warm first 10+ days of July (GFS is cool early July).

An impressively cool last week of June.

Recovering warmer-than-normal early July. (But no excessive heat).



### 2. European “Weeklies” show warming Northwest/North-Central first 3 weeks of July.



**3. Expanding California/Arizona heatwave.**

The historic California/Arizona heat wave expands to Oregon/Washington and Texas. 127 was reached in Death Valley.  
Oregon/Washington record heat over the weekend.  
Heat ends Monday.

**4. Flash flood watch due to remains of Cindy Mid-South to central Appalachians.**

Passing squalls/heavy rains and possible severe thunderstorms MS/AL to KY/IN/OH and east to PA/WV today/tonight.  
Heavy rains race east and offshore Mid-Atlantic tomorrow.  
Flooding coastal southeast LA, MS and AL continues.

**5. Medium-range loses the chill.**

Days 6-10: Cool North-Central. Wet Midwest. Western heat eases. Marginal warmth NE Corridor. Temperate South.  
Days 11-15: Hot Interior West and hot/humid South. Marginal cool Northeast.

**6. Models favor developing warmth North in extended-range.**
